

The Dialogue on the Dangers of Islamic Terrorism

Belgrade - John Naisbitt University organized the first international conference on national and international security, with a view to global challenges, terrorism and the refugee problem in Europe and the world.

The conference was opened by Prof. Dr. Slobodan Pajović, Rector of the University in the presence of the representatives of the Government, diplomatic corps, military attaches and numerous participants from Serbia, as well as the region.

Dr Slobodan Pajović, John Naisbitt University Rector, who then gave the floor to Yoseff Bodansky, the greatest American and world expert in the field of terrorism and adviser to the US Congress for terrorism. He talked about the international aspects of fighting terrorism, with a special emphasis on the appearance of the Islamic State, as well as the possible methods of fighting this kind of terrorism.

The speakers from Serbia were dr Darko Trifunovic and dr Zoran Dragisic from Faculty of Security Studies, Belgrade University, and Miroljub Jevtić from Faculty of Political Sciences, Belgrade University.

At the opening of the conference, the participants were welcomed on behalf of Montenegro Government by mr Veselin Veljovic, Security Advisor of President of the Republic of Montenegro. According to experts, this is the largest international conference on security which has taken place in the world for the last 20 years.

In his opening presentation at the conference, Josef Bodansky from The International Strategic Studies Association, explained the historical and cultural background of Islamic extremism, saying that during the Cold War everybody was focused on the balance between the USSR and
